HEALTHY AGEING

An Invitation for women aged 70+ to take part in a research project about healthy ageing

Dr Ellie Lunt, at the School of Medicine is looking to recruit healthy women aged 70 years and over to take part in her study. She is exploring how our muscles change as we age.

It's a one-off visit which should last no more than an hour and you can claim back parking and transport costs.

Background and aim

We know that as we age, muscle shrink and weaken. This also occurs when we are unable to walk or move normally (known as immobility). If we are immobile and older it can take our muscle much longer to get back to normal when we are active again than it does in younger people.

This study is part of a bigger study looking at muscle loss and weakness in older people with frailty when they are immobile following a broken bone and how they recover. The aim of this part of the study is to find out how muscles are affected by ageing when people are in good health and able to walk independently or using a stick. We are measuring muscle size and strength in healthy older and younger people to compare differences seen as we age. We will compare these to our patient group to find out more about frailty, falls and muscle loss with ageing.

The information will be used to plan interventions for our patient group.

What does the study involve?. Attend the laboratory for 1 visit.

Healthy Ageing study

We need volunteers to take part in a research study on how our muscles change during ageing. We are comparing muscle size and strength in women different age groups (18-35 and 70-100).





We are asking for 1 hour of your time so we can:

- Assess your muscle strength
- Measure how much muscle you have using ultrasound

We will provide a £30 inconvenience allowance and can arrange transport if needed.

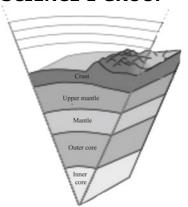
READING GROUP

SCIENCE 1 GROUP



At our meeting this month a presentation was provided by one of our new members, Duncan Short, subject was on the Anatomy of the Earth. Each layer of the earth has different properties, such as physical, thermal, and magnetic. The layers of earth are divided on the basis of mechanical and chemical properties.

Outer core: The part of core just below the mantle which is in liquid form is known as outer core of earth. Duncan also brought in some samples of stones for the members to browse over.

SCIENCE 1&2 GROUP

Science Visit to the Centre for Sustainable Chemistry Nottingham University July 19th 2019. 31 members from Science 1 and 2 had a most interesting visit to a unique building and research centre at the Triumph Road site (more familiar to most as the old Raleigh factory)

It is a leading centre for research into Sustainable or Green Chemistry.

Our visit started with an introduction by Dr Nick Bennett the Senior Project Manager followed by a guided tour of the building and laboratories.

The building is a unique zero carbon emission building primarily the structure is fire resistant treated wood, solar energy supplies most of the power and the insulation includes a living grass covered roof.

The concept of sustainable chemistry was explained as an area of chemistry and chemical engineering focused on the designing of products and processes that minimise or eliminate the use and generation of hazardous substances. The other focuses being technological approaches to preventing pollution and reducing consumption of non-renewable resources.

A presentation followed by Professor Steve Howdle (Head of School of Chemistry) where he cited examples of some current research that include using plant material and waste products from some industrial processes instead of oil and rare resources.

Finally there was time to ask questions together with light refreshments and a last look round.
